NHII Sakila Dispensary

The dispensary is a desperately needed facility that is currently addressing the healthcare needs of the residents of Sakila and the surrounding villages six days per week.

In the past, medical care has been provided by infrequent short-term visiting medical teams. This became inadequate for the constant and growing needs.

The Sakila Dispensary currently provides primary care, maternal/child care, laboratory and pharmacy services. Future goals include outpatient surgery, dental and eye care services and community education.

The dispensary employs a physician, registered nurse midwife, nurse assistant, lab tech, pharmacy tech and two assistants—all Tanzanian.


Medications and treatment supplies are a continuous need as these are frequently depleted. Funding is also needed for the dispensary staff salaries and their continuing education.

When fully completed, the dispensary will occupy 6,700 square feet which includes the outside waiting area. Various construction teams have been to Sakila and more are planned in the future to complete construction and furnish the dispensary. Materials that are unavailable in Tanzania are shipped from the U.S. in containers.
